

Deciding which vaccine to use to protect rabbits against RHDV1, RHDV2 and myxomatosis

NB: RHDV2 is a major threat to pet rabbits. Nobivac Myxo-RHD is not protective. Vector interference makes switching from Nobivac Myxo-RHD to Nobivac Myxo-RHD Plus complicated. If in doubt, vaccination with Filavac or Eravac is recommended.



VACCINES:

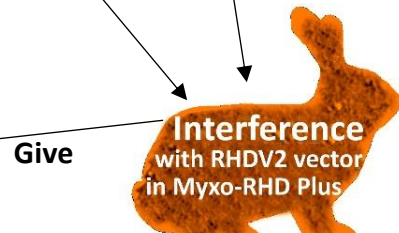
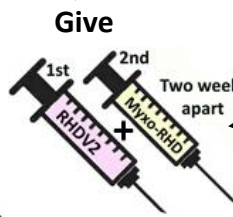

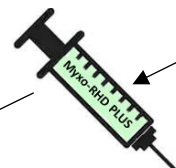
Rabbit probably NOT immune to RHDV2

Possibility of previous vaccination with Nobivac Myxo-RHD or exposure to myxomatosis

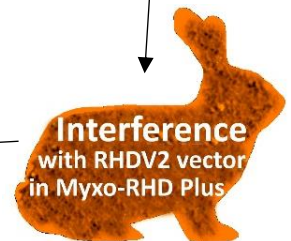
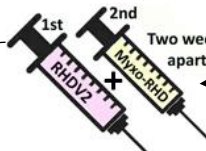
